#### Director's Note:

My first thought I had when I sat down to write this note was how lucky we are to live in a word so swally different from that of the 1940°, and while it's tuse we have advanced in many ways since then, unfortunately human nature has often proven to be stuck in the past. I did not set out to produce "Ame Frank" for political reasons, but rather for historical ones. We constantly repeat the phrase "those who forget the past are doomed for repeat it", yet we rarely do anything to make actual changes. I personally feel that is why shows and stories like this must continue to be performed and told. The challenge of this piece is how uncomfortable the subject makes people.
