

Brittany Dombrowski Class of 2009

As a freshman, Brittany set the meet record of 120'9", winning the first of 3 javelin titles at the **CHSAA Intersectional Champs.** She went on to set the NY State Catholic Record of 128'11". She was named Outstanding Field Performer at the 2008 CHSAA **Outdoor Championships, helping** to secure Molloy's first title. At Cornell, Brittany qualified for the NCAA Regionals with a best throw of 146'2" - the 3rd best throw in **Cornell history.**



Rebecca Power

Class of 2008


Rebecca won a combined 11 CHSAA Intersectional Championships in the pole vault & shot put, including the CHSAA record in the pole vault at 11'. In 2008, she helped Molloy win both the Indoor and Outdoor CHSAA championships by scoring gold in each event. Rebecca was a frequent scorer for the University of Albany: 43 points at the America East Championships in the javelin (131'), shot put (39'5"), and pole vault (11'3.75").



Jessica Conter


Class of 2008

Jessica won both the high hurdles and long jump at the 2008 Indoor **CHSAA Championships leading** Molloy to its first Catholic Title. At the Outdoor Championships she won the 200 and finished 2nd in both the long jump and 400IH propelling the Stanners to another team championship. Jessica set Molloy records in 100M, 200M, 400IH, long jump and pentathlon. She continued this success at Binghamton, where she set the school record in the pentathlon.




Dylan DombrowskiClass of 2007

Dylan Dombrowski was a 5-time CHSAA champion - long jump, triple jump, javelin, pentathlon - and was a three time All-American. Dylan also set Catholic State records in the javelin (189'4") and decathlon (6101 pts.), was a member of the National Catholic Record shuttle hurdle relay, and finished 2nd at the Golden West Invitational. At UCONN, Dylan earned All Big East/ICAAAA Honors.



AJ Power Class of 1984 Coach 1990-Present



Class of 1976


In 1975-76 Molloy won the Triple Crown by capturing the CHSAA **Cross Country, Indoor, and Outdoor** Championships. Jose was Molloy's top finisher in its 1975 CHSAA Cross Country Championship. His 13:00 performance at Van Cortlandt that day ranked 5th on the all-time Molloy Cross Country list. Jose finished 2nd in the Outdoor Championship in the 3000 Steeplechase and set the school steeplechase record at 9:42.1.



Rafael Ramos


Class of 1996

Rafael's 35.22 300 Meter Dash performance at the Indoor State Championships at Cornell was the second ranked time in the nation in 1996. He was the Indoor CHSAA Champion in the 300. He ran lead-off for our standing Stanner 800 Meter Relay record of 1:33.19 at the 1996 Indoor National Championships.



Ed Walsh Class of 1966

Ed ran 14:51.4, setting the New York State Catholic record in the Three-Mile Run at a race on the track at Van Cortlandt Park. He was the Indoor and Outdoor CHSAA Two-Mile Champion and had a best of 9:30.8. Ed ran 13:09 at Van Cortlandt Park and had the 2nd fastest Molloy performance on the course.



Tony Perrone

Coach 1969-1979

Tony Perrone guided the Stanner Track program to 15 CHSAA Intersectional Championships in Cross Country (2), Indoor (7) and Outdoor (6) Track. His teams won the "Triple Crown" (all 3 Championships) in 1973 and 1976. Molloy consistently finished in the top 5 in Penn Relays Championship of America races during the 1970s. A former runner remembers Coach Perrone: "He seemed to coach not for the glory of winning, but for the love of the sport."
