Carrino and sister-in-law Gail of Cleveland, OH, and grandchildren, James, Jessica, Jordan and Julianna Crowell and Emily and Grace Carrino.

Jim was a man of strong wit and intellect and even stronger faith. He enjoyed watching college basketball (especially his Hoyas), traveling, collecting smoking pipes, debating religious matters and politics (he moderated over the years), staying in touch with friends from near and far (several of whom have been close friends for over 70 years) and, most of all, being a loving and spirited husband, father and grandfather. While he achieved success in business and basketball, nothing gave Jim more pride and joy than his family.
